Only Jesus is able to scoop us out of our sin, declare us righteous and as Holy as God. Only Jesus can bring us all the way home.

The work God does in us while we wait is often more important than what we are waiting for.

If God were to forgive you like you have forgiven the person who wronged you, would you say you've been well forgiven? Would you be satisfied?

There is something in us that wants justice. But Jesus still hasn't seen the justice of those who mistreated him.

The difference in God and the President is when God makes a decision, He cannot be impeached, or nothing He does can be overturned.

In all the universe, there is only one person who has ultimate free will; find that person, and you have found God.

God's character does not depend on belief or unbelief of the characters He created.

## JEANNETTE CLIFT GEORGE

If God placed failure in your life, He has a purpose for it to your good. Celebrate the purpose of God.

I am so glad to be free. When the Son sets you free, you are truly free.

The times we fail to be comforted is when our back is to God, and the problem becomes larger as God becomes smaller.

If you are a child of the King, you have been transformed from darkness into light, and life can be good again with a capital G.

When you take your eyes off God and put them on your problems, you're going to find it hard to believe God has His best for you.

There are a lot of difficult jungles out

there, and it's hard to have peace in them.

Peace and freedom do not depend on our circumstances. They depend on our awesome God.

The burden you have doesn't come from you; it is a gift from God. Your prayers are an indispensable link to God's purposes.

God specializes in impossible cases; He loves to turn hopelessness into hope.

## ERWIN LUTZER

False prophets always tailor their message to what people want to hear.

There are five characteristics of false prophets in the New Testament.

1. They have their own Jesus. The false Jesus was so much like the real Jesus, Paul feared the people might not know the difference. There are many Jesuses today—the cosmic Jesus, the Da Vinci Jesus, the Mormon Jesus, the Santa Clause Jesus—who give you benefits without repentance. 2. They have their own gospel. So much of God's money is siphoned off to false prophets. 3. They have their own power. The business of miracles is Satan's most dazzling deception. 4. They have their own means of exploitation. They can do whatever they want to do, and people will fall in line. The whole idea is that everyone is supposed to get rich. If you are healed, the false prophet takes credit, if not, it is your fault. 5. They have their own way of self-exaltation. We can't make all the promises they do. Their ego is huge.

Jesus did not change the world by miracles. Jesus changed the world by His suffering. That is the message that is missing.

# We get letters . . .

I don't believe any part of the Conference could have been improved on—it was absolutely wonderful. Each singer and preacher blessed my life. There was such depth to the messages and challenges to holiness. Gracia was such a blessing—not a "poor me" story, but an "Isn't our God wonderful?" story. I came to the Conference with an aching heart, needing God to meet with me . . . and He did, challenging me to trust Him more and serve Him more diligently.

Thanks so much for our days together, and for your great leadership. I wonder how you put it all together. I sensed a fine spirit among the people, and I'm so grateful that our Lord was lifted up and praised in a loving and beautiful way—in speaking and singing.

As one who was taken to Bible conferences as a child, worked on a conference staff as a teenager and eventually became a conference speaker, I have had quite a lot of exposure to Bible conferences over my lifetime. Without question, the most magnificent time has been the recent MEF Conference. I appreciated: 1) The fact you did not charge, though it was far more valuable than many events for which a cover cost is levied! Recently, I had to miss two seminars I wanted to attend because of the cost. At present, our only income is our Social Security check,

most of which goes to medication. 2) The fact that appeals for finances were kept to a minimum. It is important that God's people be made aware of the need, but they should not be begged. If God wants a ministry to help fulfill His purpose, He will provide. 3) The emphasis on modest dress for folks on the platform. These days, that needs to be stressed. 4) The emphasis on magnificent old hymns. The fact that many folks had never heard "And Can It Be" or "Crown Him with Many Crowns" shows the need for singing great truths. 5) The emphasis on prayer. Because I am confined to a wheelchair, I was unable to attend the prayer meetings downstairs, but appreciated the brief time of prayer before the meetings. To tell of the excellent speakers and artists is unnecessary, but they will remain a blessing and challenge.

I have been savoring the blessings of the week just past. That is unusual for me. Often, when a conference is finished, I put it behind me and go on to the next thing on the calendar. But this week was so unusual and so rich, I found myself talking with my wife about the music and messages, the people we met, how much we needed to be at MEF and how richly blessed we were. The new suit you gave me is hanging in my closet. That's the first time anyone has done something like that for me. If I said thank you, that hardly seems ade-

quate. When I wear it, I will remember you, your kindness, your smiling face and your white Panama hat. I needed a suit for my son's wedding and had even thought about going to Men's Wearhouse while we were in Colorado Springs to buy one. It was doubly amazing when you took me there after our lunch together. So thanks to you, I have the suit I need for my son's wedding. That's a "God thing" for sure. I am also grateful you made it possible for my wife to come to the Conference. She loved every moment of it, from the singing of "No More Night" to the messages, the fellowship and being around so many wonderful singers and speakers.

It has been a joy to know you and your Music Evangelism ministry. Your vision and mission was not clear to me until the heavenly glory came down in my heart during the MEF 25th anniversary. My heart has been renewed not only by the great songs sung by the great singers, but also by the inspirational sermons preached by God's anointed servants. Now, I go home, not the Joseph who landed at Denver Airport June 7, but a renewed Joseph filled with songs and anointed anew.

I hope we will be together at Morogoro in August to September. I visited at your Web site, and discovered many good things. I have been praying for you to reach many people

through gospel music.

How I want to thank you for the recent MEF Bible Conference. I feel that God meant the messages just for me. I have been unemployed for 19 months. If you had charged for the conference, I would not have been able to attend. Thank you, thank you that "a price that keeps one person away is a price MEF will not pay." The messages on God's sovereignty, doubt, discouragement and the life of Joseph changed my life. I now view my circumstances from a different perspective. My greatest goal now is to glorify God. Although I have been unemployed for so long, I want to send this gift because I believe so much in your ministry.

What a feast, and I'm still full from sitting at the feet of Jesus. Thank you from the bottom of my heart for all you do and the incredible conference you and the Lord put together. Every year is better. I don't know how that happens, but this one surpassed them all. Sherin, what a job—you do it beautifully and with His grace, and He shows in you throughout the Conference. Jamall, I'm so thankful for your obedience and faithfulness. Words can't express how much the Conference means to us. The speakers and musicians were outstanding. Your crowns will be many.

# Music Evangelism to build Romans 15:1 orphanage in Zimbabwe

I've always said if I were a millionaire, I'd build orphanages all over Africa. The time has come to build at least one, even though the "Old Singer" is about as far from being a millionaire as they come.

In conjunction with the Epworth Baptist Church, located on the outskirts of Harare, Zimbabwe, MEF, with your help, is promising to furnish a building this next year that will house at least 100 orphaned children. The building needs to contain dormitories for boys and girls, an adequate kitchen, two large restrooms and a baptismal pool.

The estimated cost is \$6-8,000, not counting furnishing the home with beds, linens, clothes, etc. Luke and Ouxcillia Mandigi, pastors of the Epworth Church and our guests for this year's Bible Conference, returned to Africa July 19 and began preparations with the government for the construction of the building. The Mandigis already care for 45 children in their home and homes of church members.

The rate of exchange in Zimbabwe, now considered the world's poorest country, is 100,000 Zim dollars to one U.S. dollar. Money already given will

pay for the foundation, and hopefully the walls to go one or two bricks high. Church members will make the bricks themselves. Windows, doors, plumbing and the roof are always the most expensive items of any African building. MEF paid for the windows and doors of the First Baptist Church in Gweru, Zimbabwe 10 years ago.

Once the Epworth area council is given proof of our promise to finish the building, the land (all land is owned by the government) can be purchased by the church.

Life expectancy in many African countries is now about 37 years. Thousands of children are orphaned each year, many sleeping on the streets or on a dirt field. Helping 100 children without parents is only a drop in the bucket, but it is a drop.

Any amount of money given over and above the final cost will go into a special fund to help staff and provide food and clothing for the orphans. The Epworth Church will do its part, but with almost 90 percent of the Zimbabwe people out of work, there is only so much they can contribute at this time. MEF is committed to sending \$300 for food every three months. The Mandigis say \$300 a month is needed just to feed the 45 children they now have.

Will you help? Ten dollars of your money is 1 million of theirs. One hundred dollars is 10 million of theirs. Give up a few movies and high-end restaurants, and you have a gift to give.

Music Evangelism will not stand still in ministry. Faith is reaching out with nothing. Where there is no vision the people perish. The devil will do everything in his power to keep us from reaching our goals and realizing our dreams. Excuses will

abound. Stand on Romans 15:1. As we heard at the Conference this year: "Cast your bread upon the water and it will come back to you buttered!"

**JUST IN:** Eleven of the children need school fees of \$100 each. Since only one of 500 children get to attend primary school, we must do this. Part of the money going with Luke and Ouxcillia will go for school fees.

I realize this article is a lot to digest, but we have no course but to help.
